Dr Roberts, Rachel Mc Innis, Amanda Derosier, Jessica Torcicollo, Mr Carpenter via Zoom Meeting called to order at 7:34p by Maggie, VP in person

Dr Roberts, more and more masks coming off now that we are in our second week. Teachers have done a nice job of normalizing it for kids continuing to wear the masks. Kids don't seem phased by it. Asked teachers to talk to kids and there haven't been any concerns. Betsy asked if there were any up ticks of kids with symptoms. Essex hasn't had any up ticks in anything other than a stomach bug lately. Morning check in with the nurse every morning, and everything has been good. Parents seem to be more mindful and keep kids home when they need to.

School budget, Betsy asked if we would lose foreign language program. Dr Roberts said that there is more to be discussed on that but it looks like they are going in that direction. The SC voted on a number and there will be some restructuring, 3 PT reading techs might be lost, school psych roles might be restructured. A lot of districts don't have elementary language and seem to have more music.

Coach with Michael Eatman Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) met with all teachers on Wednesday and will help develop their awareness. 3x a year there are assessments for individual needs development. Elementary math specialist Steven Costello, came to all of the data meetings. He shared his time with Memorial and is now spending 4 days in Essex. Response to Intervention (RTI) K, 1, \& 2 for intervention grade 4 collaborating with teachers. Using data to see where he needs to focus on.
